FINANCE COMMITTEE-

June 13, 2018, Board Meeting Financial Report for April 1, 2018 to May 31, 2018

The Lake Iroquois Association Financial Reports from April 1, 2018to May 31, 2018 were submitted to the Board of Directors for review.

The May 31, 2018 Balance Sheet for Lake Iroquois Association shows \$3,565,732.25 in recorded assets of which \$542,036.44 are in checking or savings accounts or CDs.

The General Fund Budget-vs-Actual report for April 1, 2018 – May 31, 2018 shows \$71,829.81 in Total Income and \$51,406.15 in Total Expense, for a Net Income of \$20,423.66.

The Water Fund Budget-vs-Actual for April 1, 2018 - May 31, 2018 shows \$46,857.26 in Total Income and \$39,081.20 in Total Expense, for a Net Income of \$7,776.06.

The Wastewater Fund Budget-vs-Actual report for April 1, 2018 – May 31, 2018 shows \$42,909.35 in Total Income and \$29,825.75 in Total Expense, for a Net Income of \$13,083.60.

General Fund Capital Improvements Profit and Loss for April 1, 2018 – May 31, 2018 shows \$1,259.00 in Total Income and \$4,901.18 in Total Expense for a Net Income of - \$3,642.18.

Water/Wastewater Capital Improvements Profit and Loss for April 1, 2018 – May 31, 2018 shows \$188.82 in Total Income and \$0.00in Total Expense for a Net Income of \$188.82.

The Fund Balances report for May 31, 2018 shows \$3,700.00 in the Building Escrow Account; \$176,375.39

in the All-Funds Reserve Accounts; \$123,567.63 in the Wastewater Reserve Fund; \$106,934.63 in the General Fund Operating Accounts; \$60,341.81 in the Water Fund Operating Accounts; \$71,116.98 in the Wastewater Fund Operating Accounts. The total of all LIA funds equals \$542,036.44.

From May 10, 2018 through June 13, 2018 disbursements totaled \$55,808.73 Expenses over \$1000 which should be noted are as follows: \$9,041.66 ERH (Water/Wastewater Maintenance-April); \$7,711 The Cincinnati Insurance Group (gen. liability insurance); \$6,207.50 Spear Corp. (chemicals for pool); \$4,794.81 EIEC (\$4,331.67 for water/sewer lift stations/ \$463.14 for office, buildings, and street lights); \$4,199 USDA (new sewer plant monthly loan payment 92-01); \$3,428.65 Marine Biochemists (\$1,182.65 Airnox upgrade; \$2,246 for new aerator);\$1,472.53 Mullins Electric (electrical charges for the installation of new aerator); \$1,394 USDA (new sewer plant monthly loan payment 92-02); \$1,285.18 Iroquois County Collector (property taxes for 12 properties); \$1,000 Bayles Lake (July 4th Fireworks Fund Contribution).

We are still waiting on the check valves that were ordered last month we have a tentative date of June 18th for arrival and installation of same and the system will be rechecked for proper operation.

We are still waiting on bids and pricing on the enclosures for the sewer plant so we can evaluate and make a proper decision.

Mr. Aders and I met with our engineer on June 8th to discuss the progress and needs of the plant It was a very informative meeting. They will get back to us with a written statement on our concerns.
