

Play Safe on the Ice

With the recent cold snap, the ice has quickly formed on Lake Iroquois to allow members to ice skate, fish, and ride across the lake on ATVs. Remember these important tips when heading out on the ice this winter:

New ice is usually stronger than old ice. Four inches of clear, newly-formed ice may support one person on foot, while a foot or more of old, partially-thawed ice may not.

Ice formed over flowing water and currents is often dangerous. This is especially true near streams, bridges, culverts, and aerators.

The insulating effect of snow slows down the freezing process. The extra weight also reduces how much weight the ice sheet can support. Also, ice near shore can be weaker than ice that is farther out.

Booming and cracking ice isn't necessarily dangerous. It only means that the ice is expanding and contracting as the temperature changes.

There is no such thing as 100% safe ice, but being aware of the ice thickness, age, appearance, water depth under the ice, distribution of the load on the ice, and local weather conditions can make enjoying the ice much safer!
